Bharat Pensioners Samaj (Popularly known as BPS) founded in 1955 as a non-political, non-profitable, Secular organization by Justice ret'd Sh Shankar Saran along with Sh N P Shrivastav IAS (Ret'd) & Sh M Ruthnaswamy ex Vice Chancellor Annamalai University, Member P S C Madras. They got it Registered in May 1962 with Registrar of Societies Delhi under Societies registration Act 1860 vide Registration no 2023 of 62-63 with First President Justice Shankar Saran at their office 9-A, Theater Communication Buildings, Connaught Circus, New Delhi. It is also registered with NITI-AYOG India, is an identified pensioner organization of GOI M/O P, PG & Pensions-DOP & PW and is also an associate NGO of International Federation on aging.

Ever since its inception Bharat Pensioners Samaj has been working for pensioners Welfare & Rights for over six and a half decades and has been instrumental in getting several benefits to Pensioners few of which are enumerated in following Para.

Pensioners related issues raised by Bharat pensioner Samaj finds references in Lok Sabha & Rajya Sabha debates a number of times as per records hereunder:

Lok Sabha Debates - page 4171 India Parliament Lok Sabha: History - 1961, Lok Sabha Debates: History - 1962, Parliamentary debate Vol.46 issue 1-7 p.356, Parliament Debates official report p120 – History - 1978 etc. **As per GOI records, on 16th August 1968 BPS had an audience with the Prime Minister to represent the problems of Pensioners and requested for constitution of a statutory body for resolving pensioners' grievances in consultation with pensioners' representatives.** This, after years of persuasion, ultimately, resulted in creation of the DOP & PW and the SCOVA.

2. Vide Resolution No.5(56)-E.III/83 dated November 8, 1985 Bharat Pensioners Samaj with the interference of then PM Got fourth CPC Terms of Reference amended to include past pensioners.

3. Played leading role in the working of the institution of SCOVA from 1986 onwards its member up-to 2015. In 2009 BPS was responsible for persuading DOP&PW to draw definite Policy for inclusion of members in

SCOVA & restructuring of SCOVA. In 2007 it was BPS who persuaded DOPPW to launch Pensioners Portal & worked for its promotion through TV Serial e.Kranti 3 relayed from Doordarshan more than once. Bharat Pensioners Samaj was in the advisory committee of Pensioners Portal in the initial stages. The T V Serial e kranti 3 is still available on YouTube.

4. In 5th CPC BPS represented CG pensioners & was successful in getting recommendations for payment of family pension at the uniform rate of 30%, modified parity in pension & Provision of FMA. BPS Got fitment benefit raised from 20% to 40%.

5 At the time of 6th CPC constituted one memorandum steering committee & submitted single memorandum on behalf of all Pensioners associations. Just after declaration of 6th CPC recommendations, before formulation of Resolution, DOPPW under the then Secretary Ms Rajni Rajdan & Director Sh M P Singh consulted Bharat Pensioners Samaj. 6th CPC vide their Para 5.1.47 had recommended the benefit of 74% DR for pension revision of past pensioners. BPS got it changed to 86% at the pre resolution stage only. BPS was also successful in getting age related enhancement of pension, delinking 33 years of qualifying service and pension @ 50% of last basic pay.

6. In 2013 Sh J N Rao BPS vice president (West Zone) carried BPS good wishes to Japanese counterparts and participated in the World Conference Against A & H Bombs which was held at Hiroshima and Nagasaki from 3rd to 10th August 2013 where he stressed total abolition of Nuclear Weapons for the serious danger they posed for the very existence of humanity.

7. Bharat Pensioners Samaj represented by Secretary General S C Maheshwari was invited more than once by 7th CPC to tender evidence. BPS in addition to other benefits was successful in getting the recommendations for notional fixation of pension, merger of Postal dispensaries with CGHS and for merger of existing Health care schemes CGHS, RELHS & ECHS to create an integrated **BHARAT PENSIONER**

strong healthcare Network. (not implemented by govt till now)

8. Functioning of Bharat Pensioners Samaj has been a matter of interest to Sociologists, Social scientists & Anthropologists and finds a reasonable space in their books & papers. Those interested may refer to Anthropology of Ageing by Vijay Upadhyay, Journal of Sociology Research Vol. 32-33 by the Council of Social & Cultural Research, Department of Anthropology, Ranchi University, Encyclopedia of Social Work in India Volume 4 Ministry of Welfare (History)-1987, and India's Elderly Burden –Social Science by Sebastian Irudya Rajan, Retirement in India By George Manachery, A Fight for Rights By M L Sondhi, Ageing & Society by H S Bhatia, Societal Responses by Social Scientist Dr Mala Kapur Sankar Dass. SITUATION & VOICES UNFPA Publication No2 of 2002 page 108.

9. BPS was invited to tender oral evidence before Bhagat Singh Kosiary parliamentary committee wherein it pleaded for pension revision of EPS 95 Pensioners.

Several grievances raised by BPS were considered by the **DEPARTMENT-RELATED PARLIAMENTARY STANDING COMMITTEE ON PERSONNEL, PUBLIC GRIEVANCES, LAW AND JUSTICE** who have recommended redressal of these just grievances by the Govt. vide their **110th report.**

Currently, the issues raised regarding CGHS are under consideration of Rajya Sabha Petition committee.

Several of our pension & healthcare related issues are being highlighted in the parliament by the honorable MPs.

BPS is the only Pensioners Federation which is being invited in UNFPA events in Delhi On 1st October 2021 in the conference organised by the Ministry of Health & family Pensioners in coordination with WHO & NPHCE. BPS was the only organization who represented C G Pensioners. Above are the few items highlighting BPS Performance? If past records are scratched, many more achievements will be revealed. BPS has been helping Pensioners & Family pensioners in a big way over the decades.

1. That Shri Arunkumar Bhausaheb Kakade, JE HR No. 198216602 took retirement under VRS-2019 Scheme on 31.01.2020. He is holding Medical Card No. 1652 with his name and also his spouse.

2. Mrs Apeksha Arunkumar Kakade, wife of Shri Arun kumar Bhausaheb Kakade was carrying and delivered a baby on 21.05.2020 and was assigned name Namasvi.

3. BSNL MRS notification No: BSNL/Admn.I/1 dtd June 3, 2004 (copy enclosed – Annexure-A) reads: 'Eligibility of Employees taking Voluntary retirement:

Employees who have taken voluntary retirement from BSNL shall be treated at par with the retired employees, as defined in Clause 14 (IX) of BSNL MRS, for taking benefit under BSNLMRS.'

4. The Pensioner Arunkumar Bhausaheb Kakade vide his application dated 24.02.2022 (Copy enclosed – Annexure-B) made application to the Office of the PGMTD Vadodara for inserting name of her new born daughter "NAMASVI" in his Medical Card to avail facilities under BSNL MRS.
5. The pensioner submitted the required proforma for addition of name in BSNL MRS MEDICAL CARD and also filled up Form-3 and Birth Certificate of his daughter. (copies of documents attached with application enclosed herewith).

6. When the Pensioner visited the office of PGM Vadodara T.D. to know the status of his case; he was replied that "**administration replied to him – Clarification from CGMT Ahmedabad office is awaited**".

7. The Pensioner has, therefore, vide his application dated 28.03.2022 requested to expedite the required clarification by your office (Copy enclosed).

Our say

We do not find any reason for the office of the PGM Vadodara Telecom District to refer the case to your office, as the Pensioner has clearly proved validity of his request to insert his daughter's name and submitted all the departmental papers.

However, since the Vadodara Telecom District has referred the case to your office, we request you to kindly clarify the issue in clear words, as the case is over delayed in correspondence with the CCA Office and Vadodara Telecom District.

We are not concerned to know the reasons for referring the case to your office when the issue is crystal clear and reflects mindset of his administration.

Delay in commencement of family pension S. C. Maheshwari SG BPS Writes to Dir (PP)

Dear Sir,

With reference to the subject quoted as audio quality in VC was poor, undersigned could not express his points fully. However, I wish to bring to your knowledge the following hurdles causing inordinate delay in commencement of family pension especially to siblings.

CCS Pension Rules 1972 were streamlined/revised into CCS pension Rules 2021 in view of honourable Supreme court's following recommendation made in the judgement in the case (CIVIL APPEAL NO. 3173 OF 2018 (Arising out of S.L.P.(CIVIL)No. 5456 OF 2018) Union of India ...Appellant Versus R. Sethumadhavan & Anr. ...Respondents

"3.We recommend to the Department of Personnel and Training of the Government of India to try and make life after retirement easier for a government servant by having appropriate legislation enacted by Parliament or applicable Pension Rules rather than a khichdi of Instructions, Office Memoranda, Clarifications, Corrigenda and so on and so forth." Honourable Apex court, recommendation was for stream lining the pension Rules to make life after retirement easier & not otherwise. The respondent in the case was a Rly retiree. But unfortunately revised CCS Pension Rules 2021 as is clear from Rule 2(a) are not applicable to Rlys Employees for whom Khichdi rules are still prevalent. BPS therefore request application of these rules to Rly employees as soon as possible to abide by the

recommendation of the apex court. (which was specifically with reference to an ex Rly employee). Hurdles in the way of commencement of family pension as experienced by BPS are as follows:

1. Income Certificate: Earlier self declaration of income by the claimant was to be accepted.

(This was in line with Govt's. overall policy)

This provision has been changed on the plea that no family pension sanctioning authority was following it. Needless to say that this plea adversely reflects on the administrative capability of the nodal ministry.

The revised provision to submit either ITR copy or a certificate of income from SDM defeats the very purpose of the honourable Supreme court's recommendation as it has made the lives of claimants more difficult.

It is pointed out that as per the existing criteria of dependency, the income of the secondary family pension claimant should not be more than Rs 9000/ plus Dearness relief i.e. 12060 PM as on today = Rs 1,44,720 annually which is much below the taxable limit. Asking such a person to file ITR, in the first instance it is harassment. Secondly filing ITR for an illiterate hunger stricken lady (i.e. an unmarried/divorced/widowed dependent daughter of an ex employee) is not as easy as is thought by revised CCS Pension rule makers.

Ist requirement for filling ITR is a PAN Card. 2ndly for online filing one should at least have smart phone with internet connection & the basic knowledge to fill up & file ITR which majority of such claimants do not have, which means, she will have to seek some body's help which will not be free.

Obtaining a income certificate from SDM/Collector also is not easy, involves money to hire Advocate/ Agent & is a lengthy time consuming process as can be seen from attached letter of Collector Seldha. In view of the above submission issue may be revisited.

2. Non-returning of original PPO by Banks. How difficult & time consuming it is to obtain original PPO from CPPC of Banks can be seen from attached annexure of pending cases & the remarks of

concerned Rly authorities in Pension Adalats.

As such pending return of PPO provisional family pension may be sanctioned.

3. Asking no objection declaration certified by a magistrate from all the family members including those who are not otherwise eligible is also a difficult & time consuming job as all the family members/siblings may not be living in the same city and may not have cordial relations. As such no objection Certificate from those who are otherwise not eligible should not be insisted.

We request that too make life of the claimants easy & to avoid undue delay in commencement of family pension, above points may be taken care of.

As such incidences are happening almost daily in Rly hospitals, it is requested to sensitize Rly Doctors to take special care of supper Sr citizen patients.

With a heavy heart, I am compelled to pen a few lines for your sympathetic consideration and request for an early resolution for my beloved mother. (aged 83 years) who is suffering from aging-related diseases. As such, she was admitted to your hospital on 12.02.2022 and was discharged on 25.2.2022. In her discharge paper, a follow-up was scheduled for 17.3.2022 with Dr. Celestina Dungdung. It was a nice follow-up by Dr. Dungdung. Everything went to our satisfaction and the best cure and medication were provided to my mother.

Now, some grievances started with my mother on 29.3.2022 and 12.4.2022 when she was directed to Casualty OPD and General OPD respectively. She was attended by the Junior Doctors. They have no time to go through the case history of the recent past treatment provided in the same Central Hospital. My plea to refer my mother to Senior/Specialized Doctors, who had attended her in the recent past was not agreed to. The same repeatedly happened on 18.4.2022 and 23.04.2022 too Once, I approached Room No. 39 (for Senior Citizens) but attending Dr. Namita Negi could not provide

solution to our request stating that the case history of my mother is not with them. If the patient (being a senior citizen) aged 83 years is not attended by the doctor in Room No. 39 then there is no use for a special facility in such a giant hospital-like NR Central Hospital.

It is not easy for my mother to stay / lie on a stretcher for hours together, waiting for her turn in OPD. I am requesting to review the same for the sake of natural justice for senior citizens like my mother and put the things on right track without further loss of time. My humble request is that she should be referred to a specialist Doctor in Railway hospital or out

Please accept Hearty Greetings on behalf of Bharat Pensioners Samaj which represents over 10 lakh of pensioners from all Ministries, disciplines & Departments of Government of India.

Sir, The Central Govt. Health Scheme (CGHS) was started under the Indian Ministry of health & Family welfare in 1954 with the objective of providing comprehensive medical care facilities to C G employees/Pensioners and their families & dependents. Subsequently RELHS (Retired Railway Employees Liberalised health Scheme & ECHS (Ex servicemen contributory Health Scheme) Came up as CGHS off springs essentially with CGHS package rates but with variation in service disparity & discrimination between equal lives. To further supplement/strengthen CGHS, ECHS & RELHS provision for empanelment of Private hospitals exist on CGHS package rates which are very low compared normal private hospital rates (CGHS rates last revised in 2014) Moreover, the system suffer with the lacuna of in-ordinate delay in payment of empanelled private hospital bills due to which most of the empanelled hospitals deny cashless service to beneficiaries or opt out empanelment.

Sir, undersigned is constrained to bring to your kind notice that the issue of healthcare is causing lot of hardship & inconvenience to all central government employees and workers, serving and retired alike (including Railways & Defence civilians). As the Health Services, under various schemes like CGHS, RELHS, ECHS etc already in vogue for Central Government employees & pensioners including Defence Department retirees are unable to meet the requirements of the beneficiaries in the crux of the time due to their varied limitations, restrictions & locations, resulting in serious nightmare to the patients and their families, who have no other option for getting a better treatment and deal even though available nearby.

The hardships of the health scheme beneficiaries differ from unit to unit and department to department based on the specific stipulations made by the authorities concerned. For example, if a patient is referred from Railway Hospital to a Private empanelled Hospital, the patient/attendant need to undergo lot of avoidable window jobs of reporting

in various counters and sundry works like transporting papers from one seat to other and exchange of documents between Railway Hospital and the Referral Hospital even in this technologically highly advanced time of sending digital files through internet.

Just to facilitate some relief to the personnel who are at the helm of affairs, Railways has extended the benefit of option of either RELHS or CGHS for the officers of Railway Board. Distraught with RELHS, and to get the same relief as Railway Board officials, to avail the flexible advantage of other schemes, CGHS, Ms. Archana Joshi, GM, S.E. Rly & Sri. Arun Arora, GM, E. Rly requested extension of the same facility for officials serving and retiring from Zonal Railways also through their letters dt 23.3.22 & 16.3.22 respectively. (Copies attached)

In this connection, please allow me to make a simple and relevant suggestion;- With the advent of technology in all fields, the life of common people became less stressful, more in the sectors of Banking and Communication. For example, the ATM of any Bank caters to the customers of all Banks irrespective of their holding account in a particular Bank/Place etc and the same is accounted within no time to the individual's account and the safeguards are many and the facility is acclaimed by one and all. It is a great transformation when compared to the situation a few years ago.

The same thing can be brought into effect with respect to Health Services of Central Government Employees/Pensioners by bringing all the schemes under one integrated system like Integrated Central Government Employees & Pensioners Health Scheme which allows the beneficiaries to chose the hospitals as well as health units listed and the accountable and services rendered can be directly accounted in the respective Departments and Units as being done in the case of Banking Industry. By bringing all the beneficiaries of CGHS, RELHS, ECHS etc under one umbrella and allowing the beneficiaries the facility of availing medical services through single window system in all the Health units/Wellness centres & Hospitals recognised by the respective ministries through similar software, the Government will be extending a great relief to the serving & retired who are in the far end of life.

Integration of health services and allowing single window system will expand the coverage several times & create a very strong network of healthcare for the serving/retired employees belonging to all services of Central Govt (including Railways & defence retirees) within the available resources, will avoid lot of inconvenience, hardships, emotional upsets etc to the beneficiaries.

10.05.2022 Joint Procedural Order**

Sub: Reimbursement of Medical expenses-Reg.
Railway Employees are taken care of by the Railway administration in extending benefits through various Welfare measures. Medical reimbursement is one among these. In order to facilitate quick and transparent processing for reimbursement of medical expenses, the following Joint Procedure is issued.

1. All Medical Reimbursement claims are to be processed as per provisions under Chapter-VI of Indian Railway Medical Manual.
2. Medical Reimbursement claim in standard format filled completely with date and station to be submitted. (Para 653) (Annex. IV).
3. Claim should be made within 6 months of treatment. If failed, delay should be condoned by the Accounts Officer (para-652 of IRMM) duly forwarded by officer in-charge in which the employee is working/medical officer where the UMID Card is registered in case of retired employees.
4. Claim should be forwarded by Officer in charge of the office in which the employee is working in case of serving employee. In case of retired employees, the case file should be forwarded by the Medical officer of the Medical Health unit (HU) at which the UMID card is registered.
5. Emergency established to be certified by Authorised Medical Officer along with the claim with date and details of the emergency.
6. Medical Reimbursement claims of self/family members/dependent relatives can be claimed. However, family members and dependent relatives are to be reckoned as per pass rules (SC No.36/2018) to be followed.
7. Claim should be submitted along with following necessary supporting documents. (i) Hospital Bills and invoices, (ii) Admissions/Discharge/Death summary, (iii) UMID Card of self and the beneficiary in favour of whom the claim is being made, (iv) Salary slip of the recent month of the employee, (v) PPO copy in case of Retired employees. List of documents to be submitted should include Receipt

of the bill issued by the Hospital. Essentiality cum emergency certificate, original cash vouchers as listed in the Para-vii if Reimbursement claim form.

8. In case the beneficiary has medical insurance policy and intend to make claim for the treatment in question then he/she may make claim to insurance company first and then submit claim to Railway with documents, bills etc. attested by insurance company. In this context, self declaration is to be submitted by the employee as to whether he/she is covered under Medical Insurance or not. It should be ensured by the CMS that RELHS has been recovered/paid by the retired employee when claim is claimed by the dependents and the same to be certified else service certificate of the retired person to be enclosed.

9. Accounts officer under whose jurisdiction the Hospital where medical card of the employee/pensioner is registered falls will scrutinize the proposal and concur irrespective of the place of working/last working of the employee. The passing of the claims will however, be done by Accounts Officer in whose jurisdiction the employee is working or where the settlement file of the pensioner is maintained. Hence, this reimbursement arrangement is confined to employees/pensioners as per the instructions laid down in the FA&CAO's Lr.No.AEN/M05, dated 30.02.2018.

10. The sanctioning powers of the medical reimbursement claims are governed by item No.5 (b)(i) of part B Medical matters of Model SOP 2018.

11. The proposals are to be processed as per the CGHS tariff rates.

12. All the proposals are to be attached with a Top Sheet for ready reference as per the enclosure.

13. A Registration Slip as per the enclosed format is to be issued to the employee at the time of submission of the Medical Reimbursement Claim form.

14. Employee has to quote the Registration No. To know the status of his claim while enquiring at CMS/BZA, Sr.DFM/BZA or Sr.DPO/BZA offices.

15. CMS certification is must before sending to DRM for approval/sanction.

Employee prepares the Medical Reimbursement claim form in standard format signed with date & location with necessary enclosures and submit the same in the Office of CMS/BZA through proper channel.

CMS/BZA verifies the proposal within 15 days with respect to the correctness of the claim and documents submitted. If the Claim is found correct, working sheet to be prepared and forwarded to Accounts Department duly recommending the admissible amounts as per CGHS Tariff.

The claim to be verified in all respects by Sr.DFM/BZA and if found correct, signify the finance concurrence within 10 days and forward the same to CMS/BZA. If any problem is there, the proposal to be returned to CMS/BZA.

CMS/BZA should process for obtaining the Sanction as mentioned in the Finance concurrence from Competent Authority as per extant rules/MSOP within a week.

Claim papers duly approved by Competent Authority to be forwarded to OS/Welfare Section of Sr.DPO/O/BZA for preparing Memorandum within a week.

OS/Welfare Section has to prepare the Memorandum and forward the same to concerned Bill clerks to include the amount of Medical reimbursement in the Salary bill. For retired employees, the Memorandum to be forwarded to Settlement section for arranging reimbursement within a week.

Shortage of Doctors, Specialists and Para-Medical Staff in CGHS: Minutes of the 32nd Meeting of Standing Committee of Voluntary Agencies (SCOVA)

on 12.04.2022 under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble MOS(PP) at Sardar Patel Bhawan, New Delhi.

Previous: Unresolved Agenda Items of 31st SCOVA (32.1) Shortage of Doctors, Specialists and Para-Medical Staff in CGHS posts due to increase in number of patients consequent on merger of Postal Dispensaries and need for creation / sanction of new posts to maintain patient and Doctor/ Para-medical staff ratio

The Central Government Pensioners Welfare Assn, Jaipur mentioned that there is a shortage of Doctors, Specialists and Para-medical staff in many CGHS Wellness Centres in the country which is affecting smooth functioning of CGHS. Recruitment of staff on contract basis was resorted to but that has not sorted out the problem. Also, consequent on merger of P&T Dispensaries in CGHS and increase in the strength of beneficiaries, the strength of staff and infrastructure needs to be augmented.

Discussion/Decision on the agenda item Ministry of Health and Family Welfare informed that in 2019, Postal Dispensaries in 33 cities were taken over and all the dispensaries are functional. These postal dispensaries had the requisite manpower when they were taken over by CGHS. However, the infrastructure in these dispensaries needed improvement for which CGHS is taking necessary action.

As regards shortage of doctors and paramedical staff at CGHS Wellness Centres, out of sanctioned strength of 1516 General Duty Medical Officers, 1227 are in position. There is some time lag between offer of appointment by CHS Division and actual joining of the candidates. In order to ensure uninterrupted medical services to the beneficiaries, retired doctors are engaged on contractual basis against the posts of Medical Officers, as an interim measure. Presently, a total of 219 retired doctors have been engaged on contract basis in various CGHS Wellness Centres all over India. As regards other staff, recruitment is being done through Staff Selection Commission.

Hon'ble MoS(PP) directed that selection against the vacancies may be finalized early and the Pensioners' Association may be kept informed of the progress of filling up of the vacancies.

(32.2) Periodical Health check-up of pensioners The Central Government Pensioners Welfare Assn, Jaipur suggested that a periodical health checkup for pensioners may be conducted at least once in six months or one year, on all health parameters. Discussion/Decision on the agenda item Ministry of Health and Family Welfare informed that Pensioners aged 75 years and above are permitted to undergo annual health check-up. However, those pensioners who are less than 75 years of age and desirous of a medical check-up can also have annual health check up on a referral from CGHS Medical Officer. Since, cashless services are rendered to pensioners, once a referral for Medical Check-up is given, no cash payment would be required to be made at the empanelled hospitals. It was stated that the guidelines already exist for medical officers at Wellness Centres for referring the pensioners for periodical medical checkup. MoS (PP) directed that since the Pensioners' Associations have complained that CGHS Wellness Centres are not adhering to these guidelines, the guidelines in this respect may be reiterated to all Wellness Centres for strict compliance.

**Non-acceptance of Nominations of pensioners
for Life-Time Arrears by the Banks: Minutes of

Minutes of the 32nd Meeting of Standing Committee of Voluntary Agencies (SCOVA) held on 12.04.2022 under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble MOS(PP) at Sardar Patel Bhawan, New Delhi.

(32.4) -Non-acceptance of Nominations of pensioners for Life-Time Arrears by the Banks The Railways Senior Citizens Welfare Society, Mohali mentioned that as per Payment of Arrears of Pension (Nomination) Rules, 1983, every pensioner has to nominate any person for receiving arrears of pension accruing after his death (on account of Pay Commissions, etc.) and to provide such nomination to their Pension Disbursing Authority (PDA). However, in many cases, when pensioners file their nominations with the PDA, there is a reluctance on the part of the bank staff to accept these nominations, as the staff is not quite conversant with the rules. Further, the pensioners are not sure about the safe storage of nominations in the Bank and about retrieval of these nominations when needed.

Discussion/Decision on the agenda item Joint Secretary, (Pension) informed that instructions have been issued to Pension Disbursing Banks, Ministries/Departments etc. reiterating the provisions of the Payment of Arrears of Pension (Nomination) Rules, 1983 vide letter no. 1/2(40)/2022-P&PW(E) on 31.03.2022. Pension Disbursing Banks have been advised to accept the nominations under acknowledgment and keep a proper record of the same in their systems. They have also been advised to review the availability of nominations in respect of all pensioners and to ask the pensioner to submit the nomination, if the same is not available with them. Banks have also been advised to indicate the status of availability of nominations in Pension Seva Portals/ Similar portals and also in the monthly pension slips. It was mentioned that the above instructions will again be highlighted in the next meeting of DoPPW with the Pension Disbursing Banks. MoS (PP) directed that the instructions may also be shared with Pensioners' Associations.

The Ex-Defence Employees Welfare Association, Balasore mentioned that Fixed Medical Allowance (FMA) of Rs. 1000/- p.m. to pensioners residing in Non-CGHS areas is insufficient for purchase of medicines every month as the cost of medicines has increased manifold after Covid-19. A request was made to increase the amount of FMA.

Discussion/Decision on the agenda item JS (Pension), DoPPW informed that a proposal to increase the amount of Fixed Medical Allowance is under consideration. Based on the data received from the concerned Departments, financial implications on the proposal are being worked out and a reference will be made to Department of Expenditure shortly.

(32.7) – Enhancement of Additional Pension

The Ex-Defence Employees Welfare Association, Balasore and All India Organisation of Pensioners (Civil & Military), Kerala mentioned that as per the existing system, for pensioners below the age of

80 years, basic pension does not change for at least 10 years, i.e. till next pay commission. The Association suggested to consider the increase in pension @ 1% every year, so that after 20 years of retirement he/she gets 20 per cent, if alive. Alternatively, after retirement at the age of 60 years, additional 5% of pension may be granted after every 5 years which will lead to 20% after attaining age of 80 years.

Discussion/Decision on the agenda item JS (Pension), DoPPW informed that a proposal to grant additional pension of 5%, 10% and 15% on attaining the age of 65 years, 70 years and 75 years, respectively is under consideration in consultation with Department of Expenditure and Department of Economic Affairs (on the aspect of funds availability in the Budget).

Re-engagement of retired State Government officials in exigencies of services in projects where land acquisition is involved: Railway Board Order No. RBE No. 23/2022

GoI Ministry of Railways (Rly Bd) No. E(NG)IT/2020/RC-4/2 (Pt.2) New Delhi, dated: 22.02.2022

The General Manager (P), All Zonal Railways/PUs, (As per standard mailing list).

Sub: Re-engagement of retired State Government officials in exigencies of services in projects where land acquisition is involved.

Ref: (i) Board's letter No. E(NG)II/2007/RC-4/CORE/1 dated 28.11.2019 (RBE No. 207/2019);

(ii) Board's letter No. E(NG)II/2020/RC-4/2(Pt.2) dated 22.12.2020(RBE No. 113/2020).

It had been decided vide Board's letter dated 22.12.2020 that no retired employees should be re-engaged after 02.12.2020 except in para medical category.

2. It has now been decided to permit Railways to engage retired State Government officials from forest/revenue departments on contract basis for work related to Survey, updation of land records, coordination with State Government agencies for forest/ wild life clearances in projects where land acquisition is involved.

3. The total number of such engagements may be restricted to 10 in each Zonal Railway. The scheme

is valid for a period of one year from date of issue of this letter. Powers for such engagement shall be exercised by the General Managers only with Finance concurrence.

4, As regards remuneration, allowances and leave, these will be as per OM No. F.No. 3-25/2020-E.UIA dated 09.12.2020 of Department of Expenditure, MoF, Government of India which are as under —

(i) A fixed monthly amount shall be admissible as remuneration during the contract period, arrived at by deducting the basic pension from the pay drawn at the time of retirement. The amount of remuneration so fixed shall remain unchanged for the term of the contract.

(ii) No increment, Dearness Allowance and HRA shall be allowed during the term of the contract.

(iii) An appropriate and fixed amount as Transport Allowance for the purpose of commuting between the residence and the place of work shall be allowed not exceeding the rate applicable to the appointee at the time of retirement. The amount so fixed shall remain unchanged during the term of appointment. However, they may be allowed TA/DA on official tour, if any, as per their entitlement at the time of retirement.

(iv) Paid leave of absence may be allowed at the rate of 1.5 days for each completed month of service.

5. The re-engaged retired employees shall sign an agreement of confidentiality with the Railway containing a clause on Ethics and Integrity.

6, The following conditions stated in Board's letter No. E(NG)IH/2007/RC-4/CORE/1 dated 28.11.2019 shall also be observed while re-engaging these retired employees-

(i) Railway should give adequate publicity to such re-engagement, including by putting it on Railway websites.

(ii) While re-engaging such staff, medical fitness of the appropriate category should be obtained from the designated authorities as per existing practices.

(iii) Suitability/competency of the staff should be adjudged before such re-engagement.

(iv) Maximum age limit for such re-engagement shall be 65 years.

(v) The integrity aspect should also be checked while permitting such re-engagement.

7. Clear fund availability should also be ensured for re-engaging these retired employees and the expenditure towards this arrangement may be charged to the same head against which the expenditure was charged in the past when such arrangements were in force prior to issuance of Board's letter dated 22.12.2020.

Ref: This office OM in F. No. Pr. CCIT/Estt/Pension/22-23 dated 26/04/2022.

It has been brought to the notice of this office that the Retiring Officers / Officials working in stations other than their Head of Office / Department are located at are facing problems in finalization of Pension Papers / Pay fixation and other related issues regarding retirement.

2. An Office Memorandum has been issued in this regard vide this office letter cited under reference. In the Memorandum it has been directed that DDO concerned (i.e.) where Salary is paid) should take the activity of processing of pension papers / Pay fixation by taking necessary approvals from the Head of the Deptts / Office (having Administrative Control over the Retiring Officer/ official).

3. But, it is observed many practical and technical problems are faced by DDOs (i.e. where salary is paid) in taking necessary approvals from Administrative Heads of the concerned retiring Officer/ Official.

4. In view of the above, to mitigate the issues faced by the Retiring Officers / officials it is now decided that the DDO (i.e. where salary is paid) is directed to transfer the LPC's of all the employees including those who are retiring to the DDO (where administrative control of the concerned employee) immediately.

4. The DDO (where administrative control of employee) is directed to accept the LPC and process all the claims of the employee such as Salary / TA/ LTC/ Pay Fixation / Grant of Leave etc., and all other Service matters including processing of pension papers. The Service Register of the employee should be maintained at DDO having Administrative Control only.

5. All office expenses other than mentioned above may be incurred by the DDOs as per the Proceedings of the Commissioner of Income Tax(Admin & TPS), Hyderabad in F. No. CCAP/ Finance/DDOs Re-organ/2020-21 dated 29.03.2021.

6. All the settled cases of pensioners and cases where processing of pension has been initiated should not be disturbed and the DDO (where salary is being paid presently) and the Head of Office of the same DDO are directed to complete the process at their end.

7. The entire exercise as instructed Should be completed at the earliest and the action taken report shall be sent by 06.06.2022.

The undersigned is directed to refer to this Deptt's OM of even no. dt 23.11.21 & to say that the President is pleased to decide that the Dearness Relief admissible to the CPF beneficiaries in receipt of basic ex-gratia payment in the 5 CPC series shall be enhanced w.e.f 01.01.22 in the following manner:-

(i) The surviving CPF beneficiaries who have retired from service between the period 18.11.1960 and 31.12.1985, and are entitled to basic ex-gratia @ Rs.3000, Rs.1000, Rs.750 & Rs.650 for Group A, B, C & D respectively w.e.f 4th June,2013 vide OM No. 1/10/2012-P&PW(E) dtd. 27th June, 2013 shall now be entitled to enhanced Dearness Relief from 368% of the basic ex-gratia to 381% of the basic ex-gratia w.e.f 01.01.2022.

(ii) The following categories of CPF beneficiaries shall be entitled to enhanced Dearness Relief from 360% of the basic ex-gratia to 373% of the basic ex-gratia w.e.f 01.01.2022:-

(a) The widows and eligible children of the deceased CPF beneficiary who had retired from service prior to 01.01.1986 or who had died while in service prior to 01.01.1986 and are entitled to revised ex-gratia @ Rs.645/-p.m w.e.f 04 June, 2013 vide OM No 1/10/2012-P&PW(E) dt 27th June, 2013.

(b) Central Government employees who had retired on CPF benefits before 18.11.1960 and are in receipt of Ex-gratia payment of Rs. 654/-, Rs.659/-, Rs.703/- and Rs.965/-.

2. Payment of DR involving a fraction of a rupee shall be rounded off to the next higher rupee.

3. It will be the responsibility of the pension disbursing authorities, including the nationalized banks, etc. to calculate the quantum of DR payable in each individual case.

4. In so far as the persons serving in Indian Audit and Accounts Deptt are concerned, these orders are issued in consultation with the Comptroller and Auditor General of India, as mandated under Article 148(5) of the Constitution of India.

Accounting Procedure for bringing Autonomous Bodies (ABs) under Treasury Single Accounts (TSA) System:

(a) In order to bring Autonomous Bodies (ABs)/ Implementing Agencies (IAs) including, Statutory Bodies and Centl Public Sector Enterprises (CPSEs) (ltd to the grants and scheme funds in case of CPSEs) under Treasury Single Account System each entity brought under TSA System will open bank account with R B I in terms of Deptt of Expenditure OM No. F. No.26(118)/EMC Cell/2016 dt 24.02.2022. Separate accounts will be opened for receiving funds from different PAOs.

(b) Based on the Monthly Expenditure Plan (MEP), requirement and expenditure trend of the entity, Programme Division of the Ministry will process the release and issue sanction for releasing the funds to entity concerned. The Terms and Conditions regarding TSA shall be mentioned in the sanction order.

(c) Drawing and Disbursing Officer will prepare a bill on the basis of the sanction and submit the same to PAO for releasing the funds as stipulated in the Sanction Order.

(d) In order to ensure that the funds are available with the Govt till actual utilization, PAO based on sanction order, through PFMS will advise RBI to honour payment instruments issued by the entity concerned up to the limit assigned in the advice. The 'Assignment Advice' will contain data relating to the Pay & Accounts Officer responsible for accounting of the funds so assigned, Unique identifier for Sanction, heads of account and Bill prominently. A copy of the sanction order and Assignment Advice will seamlessly travel to the entity concerned. The same shall be available on PFMS.

(e) Simultaneously, to account for the issue of advice for assignment in favour of the entity in Government account the PAO will credit the amount under Public Account (Proposed Correction Slips for Heads of Account Annexed) by per contra debit to the concerned functional head.

(f) PFMS and e-Kuber of RBI will capture the details as contained in the 'Assignment Advice' for reference, reporting and reconciliation purposes.

(g) Authorised Signatory of the entity after ensuring the genuineness of expenditure with reference to the relevant "Assignment Advice" will digitally sign and issue the payment advice using the PFMS platform. The payment advice will contain all the related details of the Pay & Accounts Officer and heads of accounts.

(h) On receipt of e-payment advice from the entity, RBI will honour the same by crediting the amounts in the bank accounts of the beneficiaries by debiting concerned account. At the end of the day, on the basis of the information embedded in the payment advice, RBI will prepare payment scrolls for entire payments made by the entity against the assignment during the day and send it to PAO concerned for reflecting the same in Govt Account. Based on the scrolls received from RBI the aforesaid head in Public Account will be relieved (minus credit) by an equivalent amount by the PAO concerned in his account by per contra credit to the head 8675. Deposit with Reserve Bank 101, Central Civil Reserve

Bank (HQ), A statement showing transactions relating to assignment accounts of entities will be provided by RBI to the entity concerned, a copy thereof will also be sent to the PAO concerned.

(i) Unutilized Balance at the close of the year will lapse to the Govt and hence written back in Govt Account by minus debiting concerned functional head of account and minus crediting to the head in Public Account. Ministries releasing grants to the entities concerned will have to explain the saving in the related Appropriation Accounts. Note on second tier Entities in proposed model Since the ISA system envisages just in time releases i.e. debiting Govt account when the payment is released to the end beneficiary, there should not be any adjustment in Govt account when an Entity assigns funds to the account of its subsequent level units. Payment Advices issued by the subsequent level units against that Grant needs to contain the details of the PAO and heads of accounts. Till such time, when the amount is actually spent the balances in account of the subsequent level units of the entity will be considered as balance under assignment with the Entity.

Assignment to its second tier by the Entities:

When an assignment against grants received by an entity is released by it further to its subsidiary the advice transferring the assignment will be digitally signed by the authorised signatory of the entity concerned and contain details of the Assignment Advice issued by the Pay & Accounts Officer. This assignment will be treated as sub assignment of the entity and treated as normal assignment i.e. account of the entity will not be debited only the assigned limit will be reduced to the extent the amounts are assigned by the entity to its second tier entity. The payment advices issued by the second tier entity will contain the details of the assignment advice issued by the Pay & Accounts Officer concerned. Consequent upon making payment to the beneficiary. RBI will take action as indicated at (h) above. Original Statements relating to the assignment account will be provided to the second tier entity with copies to the entity and Pay & Accounts Officer concerned.

Since an entity may be sanctioned Grants for different schemes the scrolls so received from the RBI will be collated scheme wise by PFMS to facilitate passing of necessary accounting entries to relieve the concerned heads of accounts in Public Account as detailed above.

Specialists and GDMOs with PG degree from Wellness Centres/ Government hospitals visiting CGHS Wellness Centres

Sub: Guidelines & Standard Operating Procedure for specialists and GDMOs with PG degree from Wellness Centres/ Government hospitals visiting CGHS Wellness Centres

Background:

Consultations related to various medical specialties are frequently required by CGHS beneficiaries for which they are referred to empanelled HCOs and govt hospitals often remotely located. Presently in GDMO cadre, a number of doctors have post graduate degree, whose services can be utilized, thereby easing the burden of time consumed in availing specialty services by CGHS beneficiaries. With the intent to reduce referrals to empanelled hospitals and increase the in-house specialty facility for CGHS beneficiaries, it is proposed to deploy more GDMOs with PG degree to attend to patients in their area of specialization, in addition to the GDMOs with PG degree already working similarly and specialists/GDMOs from RML and Safdarjung Hospital CGHS Wing who are visiting CGHS Wellness Centres. These GDMOs with PG degree shall be deployed as mentioned above, in Wellness Centres of their city (and preferably in own zone in Delhi) as of now, as a Pilot Project for 60 days. Specialties chosen are Internal Medicine, Pediatrics, Gynecology & Dermatology. (Orthopedics is a preferred specialty however GDMOs with PG in Orthopedics are not currently available in Delhi and outside Delhi Wellness Centres. They shall be included as and when available). The Additional Director of zone/city would be required to create a roster for deployment of GDMOs with PG degree in their zone/city WCs, in addition to the GDMOs with PG degree already working similarly and specialists/GDMOs from RML and Safdarjung Hospital CGHS Wing who are visiting CGHS Wellness Centres.

Guidelines & Standard Operating Procedures:
Responsibilities of specialists and GDMO with PG degree from Wellness Centres/Government hospitals visiting CGHS Wellness Centres:

BHARAT PENSIONER

The designated GDMOs with PG degree posted in Wellness Centres shall be visiting other Wellness Centres from 7.30am to 2.00pm. During the Pilot Phase of 60 days, the visit of such doctors would be once a week, to the assigned Wellness Centres. An analysis of the number of patients attended by each newly deployed visiting GDMO with PG degree on a day, shall be carried out at the end of 60 days by the respective zones/cities to decide whether the number of days of visit in the month is to be increased or decreased, for optimum utilization of the GDMO.

The visiting GDMOs with PG degree (VGP) shall not be exempted from emergency duties such as night duties/afternoon duties in the 24 X 7 Wellness Centres in Delhi.

In case of planned/sanctioned leave, the visiting doctor (from Govt Hospital or another Wellness Centre) shall inform the CMO I/C of the visited Wellness Centre(s) & Nodal Officer for 24*7 emergency duties (as the case maybe), well in time before the duty roster is readied, for adjustment of emergency roster and Online Appointment roster, respectively.

Mandatory use of computer while attending to patients:

The visiting doctors (visiting GDMO with PG degree (VGP), specialists/GDMOs from govt hospitals and visiting contractual doctors) shall mandatorily use the doctor's computer module available in Wellness Centres after login to cghs.nic.in, using the user ID created by Addl. Director of zone/city, to attend to patients. This user ID shall be transferred at the end of the day by CMO I/C of the Wellness Centre visited, to the next one to be visited by the visiting doctor.

The visiting doctors mentioned above, shall independently work on the computer module without insisting on assistance for data entry
Justification:

Data Privacy Policy of GoI past experience with dependence on non-medical outsourced resources for entering patient details and medicines in the computer module has resulted in prescription errors, detrimental to patient care).

All visiting doctors whether from govt hospitals or Wellness Centres, shall access the pharmacy stock online to prescribe available medicines in the Wellness Centre, or prescribe from within the CGHS

formulary, to the maximum extent possible. The medicines shall be issued from the visited Wellness Centre's stock and indent placed to the Authorized Local Chemist of the visited Wellness Centre.

While issuing/indenting medicines for a beneficiary, the visiting doctor shall check the "history" of previously prescribed medicines to ensure that the medicines being prescribed are not already available with the beneficiary and that they do not have adverse reaction with medicines being taken by the beneficiary as advised in earlier visits. The total quantity of issued/indented medicines may be adjusted accordingly.

Medicines that are available in the Wellness Centre but have been indented by the visiting doctor shall be rectified online by the CMO I/C, before submission of indent.

In case a beneficiary wishes to get medicines from his parent Wellness Centre rather than the visited Wellness Centre, the visiting doctor would be required to enter online, the NAMES of medicines to be issued/indented with the DOSAGE and TOTAL DURATION mentioned against each, but with quantity as zero, to maintain an online record of the prescription. The beneficiary would be required to visit his parent Wellness Centre and get the medicines issued and indented as per availability in that Wellness Centre and total quantity required (based on medicine-wise dosage and duration already entered by the visiting doctor and seen in "history"). Hand written prescriptions shall not be issued by visiting doctors (whether specialist or GDMO with PG degree or consultant) except in exceptional circumstances when the net connectivity/power/server is down. In such cases, the prescription validity shall not be more than 01 month and during subsequent visit, the details in the handwritten prescription shall be entered online in the module by the visiting doctor.

As a routine, issue/indent shall be done for a maximum period of 03 months; however, if next visit is required after 06 months/ a specified time period, the same shall be mentioned in the "Remarks" Column.

Two copies of the prescription shall be handed to the beneficiary. One copy shall be used on the same day to collect his/ her medicines. The other copy duly stamped by the visiting doctor would be used by the beneficiary as a prescription when they

come for subsequent visits in the following months. This copy would be valid only for the duration mentioned (in the Remarks column) by the visiting doctor of the concerned specialty, in the prescription.

Symptoms, examination findings, investigation reports and diagnosis shall be saved in the doctor's Module under "Examination".

The visiting doctor of the concerned specialty shall advise investigations as far as possible from CGHS own labs and collection centres using the "CGHS Lab" option in the doctor's module.

The visiting doctor of the concerned specialty, depending on requirement, shall issue referral to the beneficiary for consultation, listed investigations and procedures, to be carried out in "any empaneled HCO" through the online Referral Module, so that the beneficiary is not required to visit a GDMO of the Wellness Centre again, for an online referral.

Any unlisted procedure/investigation advised by the visiting doctor may be typed in the "Remarks Column" and stamped print out issued to the beneficiary. In case of a pensioner beneficiary, the CMO I/C may refer the beneficiary to the Additional Director for issue of permission for unlisted items. Visiting doctors requiring hand holding for using the GDMO Module shall email a request to mctc@cghs.nic.in along with their mobile number and place of posting. Online training through VC mode (Microsoft Teams/ Google Meet) shall be imparted to groups of visiting doctors. Any inputs for modification in the computer module may also be emailed to mctc@cghs.nic.in.

Online appointment for visiting doctors:

As "Specialist" online appointments can be taken 30 days in advance, CMOs I/C shall ensure that online roster for visiting doctors at their Wellness Centre for the month of visit, is posted online in the Appointment System between 20th and 30th of the current month, indicating the dates when the visiting doctors would be available for consultation.

Number of appointments for the visiting doctors ("specialists") shall be ordinarily limited to total 60 patients per day (50 for online and 10 for walk-in beneficiaries). (This information shall be widely disseminated to beneficiaries through SMS, and notice board display in Wellness Centres). The number of walk-in beneficiaries can be increased to

more than 10, on mutual consent of the visiting doctor and the CMO I/C, over & above the total 60 patients per day scheduled in 50:10 online : walk-in ratio. Beneficiaries who are not computer savvy shall be assisted by staff in the Wellness Centre, to book the 50 online appointments for “specialists”, during the 30-day window period for online “specialist” booking.

In case of emergency leave of the visiting doctor, the beneficiaries who have already taken appointment and wish to get medicines repeated based on a previous prescription by the same doctor, shall be required to meet the CMO I/C for issue/indent of chronic ailment medicines for 30 days or as per discretion of CMO I/C depending on medical condition of the patient.

Role of Addl. Director:

The Additional Director of city/zone would be required to create a roster for deployment of GDMOs with PG degree in their city/zone WCs, in addition to the GDMOs with PG degree already working similarly and specialists/GDMOs from RML and Safdarjung Hospital CGHS Wing who are visiting CGHS Wellness Centres. The roster may be created within 05 working days.

Addl. Director of the city/zone shall thereafter, share the SOPs with their Wellness Centres/Polyclinics and issue official orders assigning the visiting GDMOs with PG degree (VGPs), the days and Wellness Centres to be visited, mentioning the name, designation of the GDMO and the field of specialization (Eg., DrABC, SMO, Internal Medicine). Saturdays and Mondays may be avoided being days with increased patient load. During the Pilot Phase of 60 days, initially only one day a week for each visiting GDMO with PG degree would be designated for visit to another Wellness Centre.

Addl. Director CGHS (HQ) shall hold meeting with In charge CGHS Wing of RML and Safdarjung Hospital in this regard including mandatory use of computer by all visiting specialists to CGHS Wellness Centres (as directed in the meeting on 11/04/2022).

At the end of the 60-day Pilot Phase, Addl. Directors of city/zones shall analyse the number of patients attended by each VGP in their city/zone and accordingly increase or decrease their frequency of visits.

Addl. Directors of the city/zone shall ensure that user ID & password for logging into doctor’s computer module are created for all visiting doctors whether from Govt hospitals or GDMOs with PG degree or contractual doctors. They shall also ensure availability of separate room, internet, availability of desktop computer & peripherals including printer for use by the visiting doctors, along with an examination table, foot stool, BP instrument, folding screen, equipment for PV examination (for gynecologists), autoclave, stadiometer and weighing machine. Full length A4 sheets would also be provided to the visiting doctors.

In order to ensure that the night/afternoon duties of VGPs do not fall on the days of their visit to other Wellness Centres, Addl. Directors of each zone/city shall share the detailed VGP roster with the respective Nodal Officers who finalize the roster for the emergency duties. The concerned Nodal Officers shall ensure that the emergency duties of these doctors do not fall on the same day as their visiting days [for male GDMOs, the nodal officer shall also consider the subsequent day (post night duty off)]. For other duties requiring long absence from Wellness Centre duty, the VGPs may be deployed for such duties as a last resort, to avoid inconvenience to beneficiaries.

After completion of PG Degree, the GDMO doctor on joining back or any fresh appointee with PG degree shall be included in the roster of visiting doctor if consent is provided. Also CMO I/C with PG degree may be considered as VGP, if consent is given, as only once a week visit to another Wellness Centre would be required.

Telemedicine: Shall be conducted from a location in the office of Addl Director of city/HQ only & not from any Wellness Centre or home. In the event that the patient load for a particular specialty is less, then the telemedicine may be linked to a hub in Safdarjung Hospital (in case of Delhi) where the concerned specialist of Safdarjung would attend to the patients online. Necessary instructions in this regard are to be conveyed to all cities by ADDG (HQ) and to telemedicine team in Delhi by AD (HQ). Role of CMO I/C:

The orders regarding deployment of GDMOs with PG degree with their days of visit may be displayed on the notice board of all Wellness Centres for information to the beneficiaries.

It may also be clearly displayed on the Notice Board that ordinarily 60 appointments per day would be scheduled for visiting doctors in the ratio of 50 online appointments and 10 walk-in appointments. Walk-in appointments can be increased more than 10, over and above the total 60 patients per day scheduled in 50:10 online : walk-in ratio, on mutual agreement with the visiting doctor. Beneficiaries who are not computer savvy shall be assisted by staff in the Wellness Centre, to book online appointment for “specialists”, during the 30-day window period for booking. MCTC may be contacted for hand holding in this regard.

Official stamp to be used on the computer generated prescription, with the doctor’s name, GDMO designation and specialization shall also be provided to the VGP by the CMO I/C of the Wellness Centre visited. (Eg: Dr ABC, SMO, Internal Medicine).

The CMO I/C of the Wellness Centre visited shall place demand to Addl. Director Zone/city for items (if not available) required by the visiting doctor as mentioned in (III) e above i.e., desktop computer and peripherals including printer for use by the visiting doctors, along with an examination table, foot stool, non-mercury BP instrument, folding screen, equipment for PV examination (for gynecologists), autoclave, stadiometer and weighing machine.

The CMO I/C of the parent Wellness Centre of the VGP shall not retain him/ her in the parent Wellness Centre on his specified day of visit to another Wellness Centre, either due to shortage of doctors in his parent Wellness Centre or any other reason, as this would then become a regular feature and the intent behind the whole exercise would fail, in addition to harassment to beneficiaries who have taken appointment for the VGP. However, the VGP on visiting the other Wellness Centre, may be requested by the CMO I/C of that WC, to assist in attending to general patients, in case the requisite 60 patients have not taken appointment for the day. After the day’s patients are attended by the visiting doctor, after 2.00PM the CMO I/C of the visited Wellness Centre shall transfer his/ her user ID to the other Wellness Centre/parent Wellness Centre, scheduled to be visited by the VGP.

The CMO I/C of the parent Wellness Centre of the VGP/ specialist/GDMO from govt hospital shall ensure that information regarding planned/sanctioned leave is

conveyed well in time, before the month’s emergency roster/ Online Appointment System roster is readied by Nodal Officer/ CMO I/C of visited Wellness Centre.

In case of emergency leave by visiting doctor, the information shall be posted in the Online Appointment System. In case the beneficiaries who have already taken appointment, wish to get medicines repeated based on a previous prescription by the visiting doctor, CMO I/C shall issue/indent chronic ailment medicines for 30 days or as per discretion of CMO I/C depending on medical condition of the patient.

The CMO I/C of the visited Wellness Centre shall not refuse issue/ indent of 03 months medicines prescribed by visiting doctor to beneficiaries of any Wellness Centre. However, medicines that are available in the Wellness Centre that have been wrongly indented by the visiting doctor, shall be rectified online by the CMO I/C.

Role of MCTC and NIC:

The date-wise record of online prescription complete with clinical notes, referrals and medicines prescribed shall be made available to the visiting doctors under “history”.

NIC shall ensure that separate print out can be taken out for medicines prescribed, online referral and examination findings, if required or all on a A4 sheet. The CGHS dashboard shall be modified to display data related to total number of visiting doctors who are registered in the doctor’s Module and total number who are using the doctor’s Module as visiting doctors to attend to patients.

Number of appointments for visiting doctors shall be ordinarily limited to 50 for online appointment and 10 for walk-in beneficiaries. This information shall be widely disseminated to beneficiaries through SMS.

CMO I/C cannot change a medicine indented by any doctor (GDMO/VGP/specialist from govt hospital/ contractual doctor), by indenting another medicine of a different brand, without entering the reason in the module. Once changed, the name of CMO I/C shall appear against the indented medicine, along with reason.

MCTC shall conduct online demonstration in groups for visiting doctors to work online using the doctor’s module and for any staff wanting to be trained in booking online appointment (email request may be sent by doctor/CMO I/C to mctc@cghs.nic.in).

Sub: Issue of life time CGHS Card to BSNL penrs. The matter regarding issue of life time CGHS card to BSNL pensioners who had deposited CGHS contribution before switching over to the health scheme of BSNL and are desirous of switching over again to CGHS was under examination in the Ministry for quite some time past.

2. It has now been decided that BSNL pensioners who draw their pension from Central Civil Estimates are entitled for CGHS facilities. In case of their switch over again to CGHS from the health scheme of BSNL, they are required to pay subscription at the prevalent rates only for the balance period for life time membership i.e. the number of years for which subscription was already paid by them to CGHS before being switched over to BSNL health scheme, will be deducted from the ten-year subscription period. However, the option of payment of subscription at prevalent rate an annual basis will continue to be available to them for the balance period and the lifetime CGHS card will be issued on completion of payment of subscription for the total period of ten years.

**Eligibility for two family pensions –
Clarification that no restriction under CCS
(Pension) Rules, 2021**

No. 1/1(45)/2022-P&PW(E) Government of India Ministry of Personnel Pension & Public Grievance Department of Pension & Pensioners' Welfare (Desk-E) 3rd Floor, Lok Nayak Bhawan Khan Market, New Delhi-110003 Dated May 23, 2022
Sub: Eligibility for two family pensions- clarification regarding

The undersigned is directed to state that representations/references have been received in this Deptt seeking clarification in regard to entitlement of a member if family for family pension from two different sources in respect of the same Govt servant/penr, e.g. in respect of military service and civil service or in respect of service rendered in autonomous body and civil Govt Department.

2. Before amendment of the erstwhile Central Civil Services (Pension) Rules, 1972 on 27.12.2012, sub rule 13-A of Rule 54 of those Rules prohibited grant of family pension from the civil side to a re-employed military penr, if the military penr had opted for family pension for the military service rendered by him. Similarly, sub-rule 13-B of Rule 54 of those Rule prohibited grant of two family pensions to a person who was already in receipt of Family Pension or was eligible therefor under any other rules of the Central Govt or a State Govt and/or Public Sector Undertaking/Autonomous Body/ Local Fund under the Central or a State Govt. Sub-rules 13-A and 13-B were omitted vide notification No. 1/33/2012-P&PW (E) dt 27.12.2012 (effective from 24.09.2012). Thus the restriction on entitlement of family pension from two different sources in respect of the same Govt servant/penr in such cases was removed by the aforesaid amendment

notification. This position was also clarified vide this Dept's O.MNo. 1/33/2012-P&PW (E) dt 16.01.13.
 3. The Central Civil Services (Pension) Rules, 2021 have been notified on 20.12.2021 replacing the erstwhile Central Civil Services (Pension) Rules, 1972. Rule 50 of the Central Civil Services (Pension) Rules, 2021 deals with family pension. This rule also does not provide for any restriction on grant of family pension from two different sources in respect of the same Govt servant/pensioner.
 4. In view of the above, it is clarified that there is no

restriction in the Central Civil Services (Pension) Rules, 2021 on grant of family pension to a family member from two different sources in respect of the same Govt servant/pensioner, in cases referred to in para 2 above.

5. However, entitlement of two family pensions to a member of the family consequent on death of two different Govt servants/pens shall continue to be sub to the restriction in sub-rule 12(a) & sub-rule 13 of Centl Civil Services (Pension) Rules, 2021. (Sanjoy Shankar) Deputy Secretary to the GoI

CCS Pension Rule

1. **संक्षिप्त नाम और प्रारंभ** - (1) इन नियमों का संक्षिप्त नाम केंद्रीय सिविल सेवा (पेंशन) नियमावली, 2021 है।
(2) ये राजपत्र में उनके प्रकाशन की तारीख को प्रवृत्त होंगे।
2. **लागू होना** - इन नियमों में जैसा अन्यथा उपबंधित है उसके सिवाय, ये नियम 31 दिसंबर, 2003 को या उसके पूर्व, संघ के कार्यकलापों से संबंधित सिविल सेवाओं और पदों पर जो पेंशनी स्थापनों के हों, अधिष्ठायी रूप से नियुक्त सरकारी कर्मचारियों को, लागू होंगे, किन्तु निम्नलिखित को लागू नहीं होंगे,—
(क) रेलवे कर्मचारी;
(ख) आकस्मिक तथा दैनिक दर वाले नियोजन में लगे व्यक्ति;
(ग) वे व्यक्ति जिन्हें आकस्मिक निधि में से संदाय किया जाता है;
(घ) वे व्यक्ति जो अंशदायी भविष्य-निधि की प्रसुविधा के हकदार हैं;
(ङ.) अखिल भारतीय सेवाओं के सदस्य;
(च) विदेशों में राजनयिक, कौंसलीय या अन्य भारतीय स्थापनों में सेवा के लिए स्थानीय रूप से भर्ती किए गए व्यक्ति;
(छ) संविदा पर नियोजित व्यक्ति तब के सिवाय जब कि संविदा में अन्यथा व्यवस्था की गई हो; और
(ज) वे व्यक्ति जिनकी सेवाओं के निबंधन और शर्तें संविधान अथवा तत्समय प्रवृत्त किसी अन्य विधि के उपबंधों द्वारा या उनके अधीन विनियमित की जाती हैं।

स्पष्टीकरण— ये नियम लागू होंगे,

- (1) ऐसे सरकारी कर्मचारी पर भी जिसे 31 दिसंबर, 2003 को या उससे पूर्व प्रवेश प्रेरण प्रशिक्षण पर रखा गया था, तत्पश्चात् 31 दिसंबर, 2003 के बाद नियमित आधार पर नियुक्ति की गई: परंतु प्रेरण प्रशिक्षण पूरा करना पद पर नियमित रूप से नियुक्ति के लिए अनिवार्य शर्त था, ऐसे प्रशिक्षण की अवधि के दौरान सरकारी कर्मचारी वेतन या वृत्ति का पात्र था और प्रशिक्षण की अवधि केंद्रीय सिविल सेवा (पेंशन) नियमावली, 1972 के उपबंधों के अनुसार अर्हक सेवा के रूप में गणना के लिए पात्र थी।
- (2) ऐसे सरकारी कर्मचारी पर भी, जिसे प्रारंभ में 31 दिसंबर, 2003 को या उससे पूर्व नियुक्त किया गया था,—
(i) केंद्रीय सरकार के ऐसे किसी स्थापन या विभाग में जिसके कर्मचारी केंद्रीय सिविल सेवा (पेंशन) नियमावली, 1972 के अतिरिक्त किसी अन्य पेंशन योजना द्वारा समावेश किए गए थे; या
(ii) राज्य सरकार अथवा केंद्रीय सरकार या राज्य सरकार के अधीन किसी स्वायत्त निकाय में जहां केंद्रीय सिविल सेवा (पेंशन) नियमावली, 1972 के समान गैर-अंशदायी पेंशन योजना है।
और तत्पश्चात् 31 दिसंबर, 2003 के बाद केंद्रीय सरकार के किसी ऐसे स्थापना में नियुक्त किया गया, जिसे ये नियम लागू होते हैं, इस शर्त के अधीन कि इन नियमों या इस संबंध में जारी किए गए किसी सामान्य या विशेष आदेश के अनुसार उक्त सरकारी कर्मचारी केंद्रीय सरकार या राज्य सरकार या स्वायत्त निकाय के ऐसे स्थापना में दी गई सेवा की गणना के लिए अन्य सभी शर्तों को पूरा करता हो।
- (3) ये नियम संघ के कार्यकलापों से संबंधित सिविल सेवा या पद में 31 दिसंबर, 2003 के पश्चात् नियुक्त सरकारी कर्मचारी पर भी, यदि वह इस संबंध में सरकार द्वारा जारी किसी विशेष या सामान्य आदेश के अनुसार इन नियमों के तहत समावेशन के लिए शर्तों को पूरा करता हो।
- (4) नियम 15 के उपबंधों के अधीन, उन व्यक्तियों पर भी, जिन्हें 31 दिसंबर, 2003 के पश्चात् नियमित आधार पर सरकारी सेवा में नियुक्त किया गया था, किन्तु 31 दिसंबर, 2003 को या उससे पूर्व कार्मिक, लोक शिकायत और पेंशन मंत्रालय (कार्मिक और प्रशिक्षण विभाग) द्वारा अधिसूचित भारत सरकार की अस्थायी कामगार (अस्थायी हैसियत प्रदान करना और नियमितीकरण) योजना, 1993 के अनुसार अस्थायी हैसियत प्रदान की गई थी और इस तरह की अस्थायी हैसियत के बाद बिना किसी व्यवधान के सरकारी सेवा में नियमित नियुक्ति हो गई है।

(5) ऐसे सरकारी कर्मचारी की दशा में, जो संघ के कार्यकलापों से संबंधित सिविल सेवाओं या पदों पर 31 दिसंबर, 2003 के पश्चात नियुक्त किए जाने पर केंद्रीय सिविल सेवा (राष्ट्रीय पेंशन प्रणाली) नियमावली, 2021 द्वारा कवर किया गया हो, की मृत्यु होने या अशक्ता होने पर सेवा से कार्यमुक्त होने की स्थिति में नियम 39 के अधीन अशक्त पेंशन और नियम 50 के अधीन कुटुंब पेंशन, यथास्थिति सरकारी कर्मचारी या उसके परिवार को देय होगी, यदि सरकारी कर्मचारी ने केंद्रीय सिविल सेवा (राष्ट्रीय पेंशन प्रणाली) नियमावली, 2021 के नियम 10 के अधीन इस आशय का विकल्प चुना है या जिसके मामले में इन नियमों या केंद्रीय सिविल सेवा (पेंशन) नियमावली, 1972 के अंतर्गत हितलाभ के लिए डिफाल्ट विकल्प उपलब्ध है।

(6) ऐसे सरकारी कर्मचारी की दशा में, जिसे संघ के कार्यकलापों से संबंधित सिविल सेवाओं और पदों पर 31 दिसंबर, 2003 को या उससे पूर्व अस्थायी क्षमता में नियुक्त किया गया था, जो अधिष्ठायी रूप से नियुक्त होने से पूर्व सेवानिवृत्त हो गए या सेवा से निवृत्त किए गए थे, इन नियमों के अधीन हितलाभ, केंद्रीय सिविल सेवा (अस्थायी सेवा) नियमावली, 1965 में निहित उपबंधों के अनुसार सरकारी कर्मचारी को देय होंगे।

3. परिभाषाएं — (1) इन नियमों में, जब तक कि संदर्भ से अन्यथा अपेक्षित न हो,

(ग) औसत परिलब्धियां से वे औसत परिलब्धियां अभिप्रेत हैं, जो नियम 32 के अनुसार अवधारित की गई हों;

(घ) भविष्य से एक ऑनलाइन प्रणाली अभिप्रेत है जिसमें सेवानिवृत्ति हितलाभों की संस्वीकृति और पेंशन की संस्वीकृति और संदाय की टैकिंग सरकारी कर्मचारी और सरकारी कर्मचारी को पेंशन की संस्वीकृति देने से संबंधित प्राधिकारियों द्वारा की जाती है;

(ङ.) बालक से सरकारी कर्मचारी का पुत्र अथवा पुत्री अभिप्रेत है जो नियम 45 के अंतर्गत मृत्यु उपदान और नियम 50 के अंतर्गत कुटुंब पेंशन प्राप्त करने का पात्र है और बालकों पद का अर्थ तदनुसार लगाया जाएगा;

(च) मंहगाई राहत से नियम 52 में यथापरिभाषित पेंशन और कुटुंब पेंशन पर मंहगाई राहत अभिप्रेत हैं,

(छ) रक्षा सेवाएं से भारत सरकार के रक्षा मंत्रालय के नियंत्रणाधीन, रक्षा लेखा विभाग की वे सेवाएं अभिप्रेत हैं जिनके लिए रक्षा सेवा प्राक्कलनों में से अदायगी की जाती है, और जो स्थायी रूप से वायु सेना अधिनियम 1950 (1950 का 45) या सेना अधिनियम, 1950 (1950 का 46) या नौसेना अधिनियम, 1957 (1957 का 62) के अध्याधीन नहीं हैं;

(ज) परिलब्धियां से नियम 31 में यथापरिभाषित परिलब्धियां अभिप्रेत हैं;

(झ) कुटुंब पेंशन से नियम 50 के अधीन अनुज्ञेय कुटुंब पेंशन अभिप्रेत है किन्तु इसमें मंहगाई राहत सम्मिलित नहीं है; विदेश सेवा से ऐसी सेवा अभिप्रेत है जिसमें किसी सरकारी कर्मचारी को उसका वेतन भारत की समेकित निधि या किसी राज्य की समेकित निधि या संघ राज्य क्षेत्र की समेकित निधि से भिन्न किसी अन्य स्रोत से, सरकार की संस्वीकृति से मिलता हो;

(ट) प्ररूप से इन नियमों में संलग्न प्ररूप अभिप्रेत है;

(ठ) फॉर्मेट से इन नियमों में संलग्न फॉर्मेट अभिप्रेत है;

(ड) सरकार से केंद्रीय सरकार अभिप्रेत है;

(ढ) सरकारी शोध्य से नियम 67 के उपनियम (2) में यथापरिभाषित शोध्य अभिप्रेत है;

(ण) उपदान के अंतर्गत निर्मलिखित है—

- (i) नियम 44 के अधीन संदेय सेवा उपदान;
- (ii) नियम 45 के उपनियम (1) के अधीन संदेय सेवानिवृति उपदान या मृत्यु उपदान; और
- (iii) नियम 45 के उपनियम (3) के अधीन संदेय अवशिष्ट उपदान;
- (त) विभागाध्यक्ष से वित्तीय शक्तियों का प्रत्यायोजन नियम, 1978 की अनुसूची 1 में विनिर्दिष्ट प्राधिकारी अभिप्रेत है और इसके अंतर्गत ऐसा अन्य प्राधिकारी या व्यक्ति आता है जिसे राष्ट्रपति आदेश द्वारा विभागाध्यक्ष के रूप में विनिर्दिष्ट करें;
- (थ) कार्यालयाध्यक्ष से ऐसा राजपत्रित अधिकारी अभिप्रेत है जिसे वित्तीय शक्तियों का प्रत्यायोजन नियम 1978 के नियम 14 के अधीन ऐसा घोषित किया गया हो और इसके अंतर्गत ऐसा अन्य प्राधिकारी या व्यक्ति आता है जिसे सक्षम प्राधिकारी आदेश द्वारा कार्यालयाध्यक्ष के रूप में विनिर्दिष्ट करें;
- (द) सरकार द्वारा प्रशासित स्थानीय निधि से ऐसे किसी निकाय द्वारा प्रशासित निधि अभिप्रेत है, जो विधि या विधि का बल रखने वाले नियम द्वारा सरकार के नियंत्रण में आती है और जिसके व्यय पर सरकार अपना पूरा-पूरा और सीधा नियंत्रण बनाए रखती है;
- (ध) अवयस्क से ऐसा व्यक्ति अभिप्रेत है जिसने अठारह वर्ष की आयु पूरी न की हो;
- (न) पेंशन के अंतर्गत तब के सिवाय उपदान आता है जब पेंशन शब्द का प्रयोग उपदान से सुभिन्नता सूचित करने के लिए किया जाता है, किन्तु इसमें मंहगाई राहत सम्मिलित नहीं है;

- (i) लेखा महानियंत्रक द्वारा विनिर्दिष्ट केंद्रीय सरकार के सिविल पेंशनभोगियों को पेंशन का संदाय करने के लिए, भारतीय रिजर्व बैंक आरबीआई के परामर्श से चुने गए सभी बैंक, या
- (ii) डाक घर, या
- (iii) खजाना, जिसके अंतर्गत उप खजाना है, या
- (iv) लेखा अधिकारी;
- (फ) पेंशन संदाय आदेश में ई-पेंशन आदेश भी शामिल है।
- (ब) अर्हक सेवा से कर्तव्य पर रह कर या अन्यथा की गई ऐसी सेवा अभिप्रेत है जो इन नियमों के अधीन अनुज्ञेय पेंशनों और उपदानों के प्रयोजन के लिए लेखे में ली जाएगी;
- (ब) अर्हक सेवा से कर्तव्य पर रह कर या अन्यथा की गई ऐसी सेवा अभिप्रेत है जो इन नियमों के अधीन अनुज्ञेय पेंशनों और उपदानों के प्रयोजन के लिए लेखे में ली जाएगी;
- (भ) सेवानिवृति हितलाभ के अंतर्गत पेंशन या सेवा उपदान, और सेवानिवृति उपदान जहां वह अनुज्ञेय हो है;
- (म) सेवा पुस्तिका के अंतर्गत सेवावृत्त, यदि कोई हो, और
- (य) खजाना के अंतर्गत उपखजाना भी है।
- (2) जिन शब्दों और पदों का यहां प्रयोग किया गया है और जो यहां पारिभाषित नहीं किए गए हैं, किन्तु मूल नियम, 1922 में पारिभाषित हैं, उनके वही अर्थ होंगे जो उन्हें उन नियमों में क्रमशः दिए गए हैं।
4. जिन सेवाओं और पदों को ये नियम लागू न हों उनसे स्थानांतरित किए गए सरकारी कर्मचारी—(1) ऐसा सरकारी कर्मचारी, जिसे किसी ऐसी सेवा या पद से जिसे ये नियम लागू नहीं होते हैं किसी ऐसी सेवा या पद को जिसे ये नियम लागू होते हैं, स्थायी रूप से स्थानांतरित किया जाता है, इन नियमों के अध्यक्षीन हो जाएगा: परंतु वह अपने स्थायी स्थानांतरण के आदेश के जारी किए जाने की तारीख से छह मास के भीतर अथवा यदि वह उस दिन छुट्टी पर है, तो उसके छुट्टी से लौट आने के छह मास के भीतर, इनमें जो भी पश्चातवर्ती हो, इस बात का निर्वाचन कर सकेगा कि उसे उन पेंशन नियमों द्वारा प्रशासित किया जाए जिनके अध्यक्षीन वह अपने स्थानांतरण की तारीख से ठीक पहले था।

- (3) एक बार किया गया विकल्प अंतिम होगा।

SC reiterates inheritance depends upon the question of whether a person supports the deceased in his old age or not [Read Judgment]

Supreme Court of India was dealing with the petition challenging judgment and order of the Gauhati High Court dated 7th November, 2007, passed with Cross Objection, vide which, the learned single judge of the High Court has allowed the said Second Appeal filed by the respondents herein and dismissed the cross objection preferred by the appellants herein.

Brief Facts:

P.S. Dahrawka and Kaithuami were married to each other. One son died at the age of one and half year in the year 1940 and one daughter died a week after her birth. After his death, his youngest daughter was divorced and came to live with her mother. The son Thanhnuna, who died in the year 1996, was survived by his widow Ralliani and two daughters who are the respondents herein. After the death of P.S. Dahrawka, the son Thanhnuna applied for the heirship certificate in his name in respect of the properties covered which were left by his father. However, before his application for heirship certificate could be decided, Thanhnuna died on 28th April, 1996. After his death, his mother Kaithuami submitted an objection. The Subordinate District Council Court, Aizawl dismissed the application of Thanhnuna. His widow Ralliani filed an application for restoration of application for heirship certificate filed by her husband deceased Thanhnuna. The same was dismissed. In the meantime, mother Kaithuami also filed an application claiming heirship certificate in respect of the properties of her husband deceased P.S. Dahrawka. The said application was objected to by Ralliani and her two daughters. The Appellate Court vide order dated 9th July, 2001 directed that the disputed property to be divided between four daughters of Kaithuami. The said judgment and

order of the Appellate Court was assailed by the appellants herein before the High Court.

HC's Decision:

By the impugned judgment and order dated 7th November, 2007, the High Court has allowed the said Second Appeal and dismissed the Cross Objection, thereby holding that it is only the respondent Nos. 2 and 3 herein being legal heirs of Thanhnuna, who were entitled to the rights in the property to the exclusion of the appellants herein.

Appellant's Contention:

Learned counsel for the appellant submitted that the High Court failed to take into consideration that under the Mizo Customary Law it is not only the rights which are inherited, but it is also the responsibilities which are inherited. It was submitted that the inheritance depends upon the responsibilities discharged by a legal heir towards his/her parents in their old age. It was submitted that since Thanhnuna had not looked after his mother or the family members, he or his legal heirs were not entitled to any rights in the property. As such, the High Court had grossly erred in allowing the Second Appeal and dismissing the Cross Objection.

Respondent's Contention:

Learned Counsel for the respondent submitted that the High Court has rightly allowed the Second Appeal filed by the respondents herein and dismissed the Cross Objection filed by the appellants herein. It was submitted that the property in question was not covered by the agreement dated 28th January, 1927 and is guided by the Mizo Customary Law. It was submitted that according to Mizo Customary Law, Thanhnuna being the only son was the only legal heir of his late father P.S. Dahrawka. It was submitted that Thansangi Huha was divorced on 20th June, 1980. She however chose not to stay with her mother for 17 long years. She came to live with her mother Kaithuami only after the death of Thanhnuna.

SC's Observations:

After hearing both the sides SC found that till his death, Thanhnuna was looking after his mother. However, after his death, Thansangi Huha came back to her original home to look after her aged mother Kaithuami. SC found that the provision of Mizo Customary Law relating to 'divorced' (Hringkir) in the matter of inheritance would apply to her and her right to inheritance of her father's properties subsists by virtue of her being divorced (Hringkir) and coming back to the original family for looking after the mother.

SC found that as per the Mizo Customary Law, it is the youngest son, who would be entitled to inherit the property of his father; there is an ample scope for distribution of the property in a fair and reasonable manner.

SC stated that the District Council Court found that since Thansangi Huha (appellant No.4 herein) had discharged her responsibility of looking after her mother till her death and was occupying the main bed and reassuming her father's clan title 'Hahu', her right to inherit her father's properties could not be defeated.

SC relied upon the case of Thansiami vs. Lalruatkima and ors. where the Court held that the inheritance depends upon the question as to whether a person supports the deceased in his old age or not. It has been held that even if a natural heir does not support his parents, he would not be entitled to inheritance. It has further been held that even if there is a natural heir, a person who supports the person until his death could inherit the properties of that person.

SC Held:

After evaluating submissions made by both the parties the SC held that "we are therefore of the considered view that the High Court was not justified in reversing the well-reasoned and equitable judgment and order passed by the District Council Court dated 28th February, 2006"

Case Title: Smt. Kaithuami Through L.RS. v. Smt. Ralliani and others

CUTTACK: The Orissa high court has issued an order for immediate payment of family pension to one Kantaro Kondagari, a transgender person, as per provisions meant for unmarried daughters of deceased employees.

Kantaro's father, Balaji Kondagari, was a government employee in the rural development department in Rayagada district. After Balaji's death, the family pension was sanctioned and disbursed to his wife Binjama. On July 17, 2020, Binjama died of age-related ailments. Thereafter, Kantaro, who is unmarried, applied for the family pension.

Though it was sanctioned by the competent authority in Kantaro's favour on June 29 last year, the principal accountant general (A&E), Odisha, did not take any step for disbursement of the family pension in her favour.

Kantaro filed a petition seeking the HC's intervention for sanction of the family pension within a stipulated time.

While allowing it, the single-judge bench of Justice AK Mohapatra said the petitioner, as a transgender, has every right to choose her gender and accordingly, she had submitted her application for grant of family pension under Section 56(1) of the Odisha Civil Services (Pension) Rules, 1992. "Such right has been recognised and legalised by the Supreme Court," Justice Mohapatra observed in his May 20 order.

Kantaro is a transgender person as per the certificate issued by the district magistrate under the Transgender Persons (Protection of Rights) Rules, 2020.
